I think the most interesting route that I ever took was during an adventure tour across Central Asia I took the trip with a friend of mine two years ago. We started off in Istanbul, Turkey, and then we travelled east, along the old Silk Road across Asia, travelling by bicycle almost all of the time. We took buses and ferries a couple of times, and once we had to take a short flight by airplane, but everything else was done by leg-power. It was good thing we trained before starting our journey.

We finally ended our trip a year later in northern India, after cycling more than ten thousand kilometers.
