Drawings of totemic ancestors, such as crocodiles or birds, and their actions, have been made on bark and cave walls by Australian Aboriginals, as well as through songs and rituals, 1) In the Marshall Islands in the Pacific Ocean are found stick charts, which give an idea of what maps in ancient time might have looked like. The charts are memory aids showing the swells of the ocean that were studied and learnt prior to a sea voyage. They recorded different features from today's maps, but 2) In Mesopotamia, in modern day Iraq, ancient clay tablets dating back as far as he 3rd Century BC have been found depicting estates and, at times, cities such as Nippur, south of Babylon and the Euphrates near its centre. The Nazca lines in Peru in South America are few maps from Ancient Egypt with those 3) after the annual Nile floods. However, the Turin papyrus map dating from about the 12 the Century BC was used for those on quarrying expeditions and contains topographical features such as mountains, wells and road networks. At a much later date, in The Middle Ages, remarkably accurate sea charts, called portolans, were used with the magnetic compass, 4) These sea charts were all created in the same way from vellum from goats or sheep skin. Further, they were rectangular in shape with the neck skin of the animal still attached. They also all had line drawings in coloured ink. The charts basically consisted of a network of line drawings, with the cartographer drawing a hidden circle around a central point and then vertical and horizontal lines through the centre. A series of other circles were drawn with similar lines. Depending on the direction, these lines were then drawn in different colours.
